## MUCH MORE THAN STAINED GLASS

As beautiful and compelling as our new stained-glass windows are, they even speak to us of divine and holy things we might not notice at first glance. (The window will be officially dedicated on August 20<sup>th</sup> in memory of one of our members.)

At the center of the new doors is a brown empty wooden cross representing our crucified, risen, and ascended Lord Jesus Christ. The lilies on the cross speak to us of the new life that blooms in our Lord Jesus and the new life that is ours through Holy Baptism. The bowing, prayerful angels represent the overwhelming response of worship and awe for the love of God that made our salvation possible. The colorful lines that emanate from the cross in brilliant colors remind us of the power of the Gospel to reach the ends of the earth with hope and Good News.

Both the new doors and windows brighten our narthex and our church while also opening us to see the community and they see us and who we are through Christ.

On the left side of the new windows are some circles with specific images. The first shows us Jesus blessing and teaching little children. This of course reminds us of the importance of our Preschool and Sunday School programs as we share the love of Jesus with our children.

Below that we see a circle with flowers (Mums) which happened to be the favorite flowers of our deceased members. It also reminds us of Jesus teachings concerning the lilies of the field and all of His creation. Finally, we see the praying hands which speak to us of our complete dependence on our creator and redeemer God.

On the right side we see a circle with an open Bible with a dove, signifying the Holy Spirit, who gave us God's Word for all time. Included is an incredible promise in Isaiah 41:10 which points us to all of God's promises throughout Scripture. It is also the confirmation verse of our deceased member.

Next is a Chalice, Host, grapes, and a cross to point to the God-given sacraments, especially Holy Communion in which we receive his true body and blood to assure us of the forgiveness of sins won for us on the cross.

On the bottom we see the two tablets of stone representing the Ten Commandments which tell us how we are to live in response to God incredible love and salvation freely given to us in Jesus!

What a rich and wonderful gift this is! It will speak to us and our children for generations yet to come!

To the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit be all the glory now and forever!



Seltz's last broadcast will be recorded in Wittenberg and aired Reformation weekend, Oct. 29.

"In a year where we celebrate the 100th anniversary of Lutheran Hour Ministries, we are extremely pleased to honor the legacy of The Lutheran Hour program by announcing that these two popular speakers have agreed to assist us while we search for the next individual who will share the Good News of Jesus Christ over the airwaves," says LHM President & CEO Kurt Buchholz. "Generations of people in our listening audience have been blessed to learn from and be strengthened in the faith by Dr. Klaus and Dr. Meyer. We look forward to their continued role in this important ministry that remains a critical part of LHM's focus on media outreach."

Klaus retired from the full-time speaker role in 2010 and has been recording one sermon a month for The Lutheran Hour and writing many of LHM's Daily Devotions. Meyer served as speaker from 1989 through 2001 (as well as host of LHM's On Main Street weekly television program) and currently serves as president of Concordia Seminary in St. Louis.


### Second Chance News

Education is important for every community, especially where poverty or disaster has limited the options for young people to reach their potential. ### LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF MAKES A DIFFERENCE THROUGHOUT THE WORLD

In the spring of 2016, a shipment of Quilts, School Kits, Personal Care Kits, Baby Care Kits and Fabric Kits traveled to Peru. LWR staff and their partner, CARITAS, distributed the quilts and kits to 30,600 women, men and children all across the country. Mountain dwelling families especially welcomed the warmth of quilts as winter temperatures began to set in, hitting average lows in the 30s in July and August.

The blessing of your gift doesn't end there! In the LWR long-term projects in Peru, students receive Personal Care Kits that help their families learn better hygiene, which also helps strengthen their dairy and cheese livelihoods.

In Syria, years of ongoing conflict have left entire cities and the country in shambles, with many people struggling for daily survival. High on the list of needs for the people of Syria is a daily staple: bread!!

With your support, LWR is able to work inside Syria, helping repair and renovate bakeries in two areas of the Aleppo district. Those bakeries will go on to provide affordable, daily bread to more than 80,000 people.

The above are just two examples of how your gifts help alleviate suffering around the world.

The spring of 2017 was another successful collection for Lutheran World Relief. The annual ingathering from Rutersville from local/area churches totaled 1,283 Quilts, 24 Blankets, 806 School Kits, 58 Baby Care Kits, 28 Fabric Kits and 348 pounds of soap. With proceeds from a silent auction the Mary Martha Guild contributed \$140.00 towards the LWR Shipping Fund.




